This is it, closing night, and the end of the production Except for tomorrow which is the FULL show reduction

As is custom at the end of a show or a musical I wax poetic with words in a form Seussical

She crafted fictitious characters from Deep River folks Shallow people with deep secrets mixed with long running jokes

For an evening adventure add live music and food Culinary Delights and a bar – that makes everything good

For learning lines, tickets, tshirts, build and decorate the set Programs, magnets, posters and makeup, props, and costumes to get

The prep for the show was made a lot less stressy By the trifactal force I call Hurricane Bessey (Sara, Sam and Samantha).

Sara finished publicity by the end of week one What's next? Front of House? Are the table decs done? She spent seven whole dollars on a wedding resell Made pencil jars, "real case" bottles and the tables looked swell

Samantha jumped in wherever I asked for assistance Makeup, table prep and ushers and handled patron resistance

Molly rigged light trees and loaded in a shit ton of tech Texting sounds, time passing, screams and flush special effects

Shonna made the actors all look well coiffed and pretty And Evan swept floors when they got gritty

From behind the black curtain, Trish ran the show Calling cues, herding actors where they needed to go

Lori based it on Deep River people she's met it is true Shallow characters with deep secrets and yes, that might mean you

Mac and Sandra teamed up to direct the cast Brought the 2D words to life and they had a blast

Even without dancing, Mac's creative mind always "open to try" And Sandra reined him in when things flew up too high

Tweaking the words, and embellishing mostly with restraint Though some of Sam's lines make me feel a bit faint

The crowd loved Ike's tutu and glittering eyes "Like a bear", and "I've been in every show" drew laughter and sighs

Bailey's snotting and hacking was amazingly gross And her slurred Nyquil ranting – I liked that the most

What happened to that whoopey cushion? There's a perplexa How we laughed when Abbey chucked the demon Alexa

The ladies all cheered to see Simon's legs bare And Jim's corset and collar made everyone stare.

Jenna's delusions of grandeur and a new Centre for Art No more basements or pillars and no more of "that" Rebecca's need for more coffee, while Abbey fed her the facts The fun repartay kept the show on its tracks.

Though no 27 kids or a dog in this one Christine's "I was a good kid" was so cute and fun.

And Eve's evil eye gave me shudders each night I'm the Star, I remember you – you nailed it just right.

Mayor Adelaide – who knew she could be so calm and bland After killing some one when "things got out of hand"

So thanks to you all for your work and the laughs The easy, fun times and especially the gaffs

14 minutes of adlib while we "find the police" Was enough to bring Sandra, Mac and Trish to their knees.
